CODE VIOLATION ENFORCEMENT-DEFERRED REHAB LOAN PROGRAM INSTRUCTIONS TO BECOME A CITY-CERTIFIED CONTRACTOR

In order to become a city-certified vendor, the contractor ("vendor") must register to receive payments via ACH (automated clearing house) which is a network used for electronic payments. ACH is the City's only method of providing payment. The following are the required steps to become a city-certified vendor:

o Complete W-9 form.

The W-9 form is required to obtain a vendor number. This vendor number is verification that your entity is a certified vendor of the City and is authorized to receive payments via ACH. The W-9 form is used to generate the 1099-MISC form. The SRO hotel owner will receive this 1099-MISC form at the end of the year, the same year the rebate was disbursed for tax reporting purposes.
