**Public Review of and Comment on
San Francisco's Proposed Uses of CARES Act CDBG Round 3 Funds**

The U.S. Department of Housing and Urban Development (HUD) has allocated another round of Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funding to the City and County of San Francisco under the Coronavirus Aid, Relief, and Economic Security (CARES) Act to help prevent, prepare for and respond to the impacts of the global COVID-19 pandemic. The amount of this round of CARES Act CDBG funding for San Francisco is \$9,626,923. San Francisco received \$10,972,734 in the first round of CARES Act CDBG funding. HUD's second round of CDBG funding was distributed to States. This is HUD's third round of CDBG funding. San Francisco has also received funding from HUD under the CARES Act Emergency Solutions Grant (ESG) and Housing Opportunities for Persons With AIDS (HOPWA) programs under the first and second rounds of funding. HUD has approved the first and second Amendments to San Francisco's 2020-2021 Action Plan for the uses of the first and second rounds of HUD CARES Act funding.

MOHCD will make available a third Amendment to San Francisco's 2020-2021 Action Plan for public review and comment from March 16, 2021 to March 22, 2021. This third Amendment will include the proposed uses of the third round of CDBG funding as well as the proposed revised uses of the second round of ESG funding under the CARES Act.

The 2020-2021 Action Plan is the first-year implementation plan under the 2020-2024 Consolidated Plan. It outlines community development and affordable housing strategies and priorities that will be supported with HUD funding and other funding administered by MOHCD during the program year that starts on July 1, 2020 and ends on June 30, 2021. HUD requires that the plan be amended to incorporate the CARES Act funding and its proposed uses.

The third Amendment to San Francisco's 2020-2021 Action Plan will be available for review beginning Tuesday, March 16, 2021. The draft document will be available electronically on the MOHCD website at <https://sfmohcd.org/>. Due to the current shelter in place order, hard copies of these documents will not be available.
