The recreation center would include an approximately 7,650-square-foot gymnasium containing an indoor basketball court, a multipurpose room, a lobby, and a small office. The recreation center would also include tiered seating, restrooms, a small kitchen, and space for storage and building mechanical systems. The project would include the following outdoor improvements: a plaza at the entrance of the new recreation center; installation of adult fitness equipment in an area called the "Fitness Terrace"; a central activity space ("Lookout Terrace") with picnic tables and wood and rock landscape elements; lighting; new trees and landscaping; and pathway improvements to allow for circulation into and and landscaping; and pathway improvements to allow for circulation into and through the park. mental quality.
