Thank you for consulting with our office pursuant to Stipulation XI.D. of the Programmatic Agreement (PA) by and among the City and County of San Francisco, the California State Historic Preservation Officer, and the Advisory Council on Historic Preservation regarding the Historic Properties Affected by Use of Revenue from the Department of Housing and Urban Development Part 58 programs.

The Northwest Information Center of the California Historical Resources Information System has determined that the project site has a moderate potential for encountering both Native American archaeological resources historic-period archaeological resources. They "recommend a qualified archaeologist [to] conduct further archival and field study to identify cultural resources, especially a good-faith effort to identify those buried deposits that may show no signs on the surface." Pursuant to Stipulation XI.D.1. of the PA, I concur with their recommendation.
